Link to Activity

In this lesson, students will work toward understanding what it means to have a learning disability. They will also discuss ways in which labels about intelligence are used to discriminate against people, and develop more constructive, specific vocabulary for discussing learning needs

Grades K-2



Link to Activity

In this lesson, children will consider what's involved in creating spaces for people who are differently-abled and learn how art can be used to create a more open and accessible world. Students will be able to identify and analyze ways of designing

spaces for people with disabilities.

Grades 3-5



Link to Activit

In this lesson, students learn about the principles of universal design, analyze examples of it, and develop their own product, communication or environment in accordance with its principles. Activities will help students recognize the elements of universal design

Simulation Activities

Consider showing this page of text to your child. Have them read it out loud. They must read the COLOR the word is written in, not the word itself. Afterward, discuss how your brain wants to read the actual word. This is an example of how difficult it may be for students with learning disabilities to get through the school day. Their brain may understand what needs to be done, but they may struggle to make it come out. The difficulty of completing this activity is meant to simulate how arduous tasks can be for students who learn differently.

Learning Challenges Committee


